
BEST SPOTS FOR NEW YEAR'S 2011

MARRAKECH, **MOROCCO** FÊTE FACT

FRENETIC AND EXOTIC, Marrakech is awash in color as djellaba-cloaked hawkers and turbaned snake charmers clamor around the Medina and Djemaa El Fna square. Home to Morocco's largest souk (open-air market), Marrakech also boasts palaces and mosques that are architectural gems. SITUATED OVER the VItava River, the "city of 100 spires" is heralded as one of the world's most beautiful and exciting urban destinations. On New Year's Eve, Prague revels under a canopy of its renowned fireworks, with throngs lining the riverbanks and flocking to the famed Astronomical Clock (Prague Orlog).

Riverboats host opulent New Year's dinner parties, as they cruise past such attractions as Charles Bridge, Malá Strana, National Theater Opera, Parliament, Prague Castle and Vysehrad Fortress. Afterward, check out one of the city's fabulous clubs in the Staré Mesto (Old Town) district to usher in the new year.

CAPE TOWN, **SOUTH AFRICA** FÊTE FACT

RIBBONS OF WHITE SAND frame the Atlantic Ocean here, while iconic Table Mountain and Signal Hill rise dramatically above South Africa's most scenic and multicultural city. This animated destination ignites on Dec. 31, when Cape Town's waterfront teems with activity, including fireworks and costumed dancers, face-painted partiers and musicians.

For a hit of nonaddictive psychotropic entertainment, head to the Rezonance Festival, a three-day outdoor electronic music event in nearby Franschhoek Valley that begins on New Year's Eve.




